Barring Workshop Online

Course Overview:

This workshop is a must if you are an Employer, Manager or responsible for making employment decisions. It will provide essential information to assist safer recruitment and aims to explore and understand the benefits of DBS and the employer working together, look at the three different referral routes and when a DBS barring referral should be made, including when the legal duty is met. It will also look at Regulated Activity and Relevant Conduct and Harm Test.

By the end you will have a clear understanding of the consequences of not making appropriate barring referrals and the consequences of being included in one or both Barred Lists.

Safeguarding

All our safeguarding courses are in line with the new categories outlined in the Standards and once completed each participant will receive a certificate with the category and topics covered listed.

Further changes made to the National Minimum Standards will be reflected as required with a top up session. This top up session will be free of charge to those who have attended training of any of the safeguarding categories.

Safeguarding – Category A (Introductory Level) Online

Audience:

Suitable for anyone working or volunteering in the early years sector. This includes cooks, caretakers and anyone affiliated with the childcare setting. Early Years Wales' Category A safeguarding training is above the basic requirement, however, the virtual course provides learners with opportunities for discussion and sharing learning with peers.

Course Overview:

The aim of this introductory level course is to ensure anyone working within early years is aware of the different aspects and requirements of safeguarding children in Wales – ensuring their well-being and protecting them from harm, the duty to report any concerns and the need for following procedures.

Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of the course all participants will be aware of:

- The Wales Safeguarding Procedures and key safeguarding terms
- The need to be child-centred in safeguarding
- Potential indicators of abuse, neglect, and harm, including Abuse: Physical, Sexual, Domestic, Emotional Neglect: Physical, Emotional, Medical, Nutritional, Supervisory, Educational, Identity
- Their duty to report when and how to deal with a protection suspicion, concern, or disclosure, including record keeping, sharing information, and making reports

Safeguarding – Category B Online

Audience:

Childcare workforce, Nursery workers, nannies, and childminder assistants; Nursery managers, Childminders, Responsible Individuals (RIs), Designated Safeguarding Person (DSP)

Course Overview:

The aim of this course is to ensure participants know what to look for and have a clear knowledge of the reporting process and their own responsibilities.

Learning Objectives:

Upon completion of the course all participants will be aware of:

Roles of safeguarding:

- You and your setting's role and responsibilities in safeguarding
- The roles of different agencies and others involved in safeguarding children's welfare.

Working in a child-centred way - how to:

- balance child's rights with your duty of care
- promote child's voice at all times.

<u>Membership in Wales:</u>

- How to work in ways that keep YOU safe from abuse, harm or neglect.
- How to access support and training to think about and improve safeguarding knowledge, skills and practice.
- How to get advice and support, if needed.

Recognising Risk:

- Why some children could be more at risk from abuse, harm or neglect,
- Why people may not disclose abuse.
- Features of abusive behaviour including bullying and grooming, DV behaviours

Completing a Multi-Agency Referral Form (MARF):

- Practical guidance on completing a Safeguarding Children Report/referral.
- How to address potential barriers to staff/volunteers reporting or raising concerns
- How to follow your organisation's whistleblowing policy.

Safeguarding – Category C

Online

This is an advanced level and learners will need to have completed categories A&B or previous safeguarding training.

Audience:

Childcare managers; Childminders; Designated safeguarding person (DSP); Responsible Individuals (RIs)

Aim:

The aim of this **advanced** level session is to familiarise participants with what happens and ensure they are able to take part in each of the safeguarding stages after a safeguarding report has been made.

Course Outline:

- Initial Decision
- Strategy Discussion
- Section 47 Enquiries
- Child Protection Conference
- Child protection Plan / Child protection Register.
- De-registration
- Child Practice Review (Single Unified Review)
- Professional Challenge Able to escalate and act where there are ongoing concerns about harm, abuse or neglect, or where concerns have not been addressed after reporting.
- Well-being and signposting

The NMS requirement is that this training provides 12 hours of taught learning time. Sessions are broken up into three, four-hour blocks so that reflection and completion of the workbook is provided in between sessions. All sessions need to be attended to be compliant.

All staff must attend safeguarding training suitable to their role and all new requirements concerning the required Safeguarding training must be met by end of November 2024. It will be the responsibility of the person attending the training to produce the certificate and workbook containing the evidence that has been covered in this course to present to CIW at inspection.

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Writing a Safeguarding Report (Referral) / How to Write a Report Online

Aim:

This session aims to provide participants with practical guidance on completing a Safeguarding Children Report (safeguarding referral).

Course Overview:

This course is aimed at DSPs, Managers, Senior Staff (anyone who will be expected to participate in the Safeguarding process following a report). The aim of this course is to ensure participants understand the stages of the safeguarding process following report, their potential roles, and responsibilities in each stage, and where to find further guidance and information.

Outline:

- Overview of relevant terminology (from Wales Safeguarding Procedures)
- Overview of information sharing guidelines and protocols
- Overview of confidentiality rules
- Consent of child, of parent/carer, and reporting without
- How to complete a Multi Agency Referral Form, section by section
 - ensuring voice of child / child-centred
 - what information is required in each section
 - how much to provide and how to present it
 - what the report taker requires

Understanding Neurodiversity in Early Childhood with Kerry Murphy Online

Kerry is an independent early year's specialist and trainer with a focus on additional learning needs, well-being and behaviour.

Audience

Childcare workforce, Nursery workers, nannies, and childminder assistants; Nursery managers, Childminders, named individual who has responsibility for ALN in the setting

Course Overview:

In recent years, there has been a raised awareness of neurodiversity and how understanding developmental differences (neurodivergence) can help us move away from traditional deficit narratives that view children as problems to be fixed or cured. Educators are increasingly interested in developing strengths-based approaches that are empowering for children identified with additional learning needs (ALN) in the early years. This online webinar introduces neurodiversity in an accessible way and provides key strategies that can be translated to practice. Our current education system favours children with typical minds and able bodies (known as ableism), meaning that children whose development is different do not always develop a sense of belonging. Divergent development is often absent from our frameworks or viewed as a deficit or "red flag". Here we will unpick what this means for our practice and how we might challenge this to become more inclusive.

Across this online seminar, you will learn about the following:

- Understanding ableism and neurodiversity
- Developing Divergent Pathways of Development
- We will explore how we can develop confidence with the development that diverges from typical "milestones" and begin to honour learning differences. We will focus on communication & interaction and the social, emotional and wellbeing of our emerging neurodivergent and disabled children.

Neurodiversity and Play Patterns with Kerry Murphy Online

Course Overview:

There is a widespread assumption that play does not come naturally to children identified with additional learning needs (ALN). Children are often defined by how they play, and this can lead to us taking a deficit approach to children with developmental differences and disabilities. In this online webinar, we will challenge some outdated ideas about play, for example, that repetitive play should be stopped or that solitary play is a problem. This results in us missing all the wonderful and diverse ways in which children play. This online seminar introduces you to the importance of self-directed play and how it can support children with developmental differences. You will have the opportunity to reflect on the different play patterns and re-think why all play is okay.

You will learn about the following:

- The definition and features of self-directed play and consider how it relates to children with developmental differences and disabilities.
- Assumptions that are made about children's play.
- Emphasise the benefits and potential of self-directed play for all children
- Explore play patterns and consider the benefits to children with developmental differences and disabilities.
- And finally, you will be introduced to some new strategies for empowering play for all children.

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Nature Notes with Nia Beynon Online

Audience:

Foundation learning, Childcare workforce, Nursery managers, Childminders

Course overview:

The purpose of the session is to share an innovative resource Nature Notes/Nodau Natur, that was originally produced through the medium of Welsh and commissioned by Mudiad Meithrin.

The resource has now been recognised for its importance to the early years sector and has been commissioned for adaptation into English by Early Years Wales.

The content of the session will include the ability to:

- become familiar with the content of the resource which supports an appreciation the diverse cultures of Wales
- develop knowledge of how rhymes/songs enrich the development of young children
- discuss the effect of celebrating diversity, and the richness of other cultures that surround us, through rhymes

You will be guided through the new multilingual resource to become familiar with songs and customs from Wales and other cultures and languages including Bangla, Polish, Urdu and Romanian.

Following the session, the resource can be accessed on the Early Years Wales website allowing you to enjoy its content with the children immediately. In addition, the resource will support the work of setting staff working with all children, including some families whose first language is not English or Welsh. The resources will open a door for children and practitioners to new languages and the rich cultures that surround us. **The resources will be available for free to all members following the training.**

Course overview:

During the session, a new resource 'Through the eyes of a child'/ Trwy lygad plentyn, will be launched. This has been specially commissioned by Early Years Wales and is aimed at developing best practice in early years environments. The resource is available in both English and Welsh.

Aims:

- to become familiar with the content of the resource and how it can be used to support developments
- to appreciate that scientific research on the early years influences changes and developments on practice
- to consider the very best early years practice with particular reference to the three environments

Gaining knowledge of the resource content and suggestions will re-define how settings develop their practice. Ultimately this will ensure positive outcomes for children in the present and in future years. **The resources will be available for free to all members following the training.**
