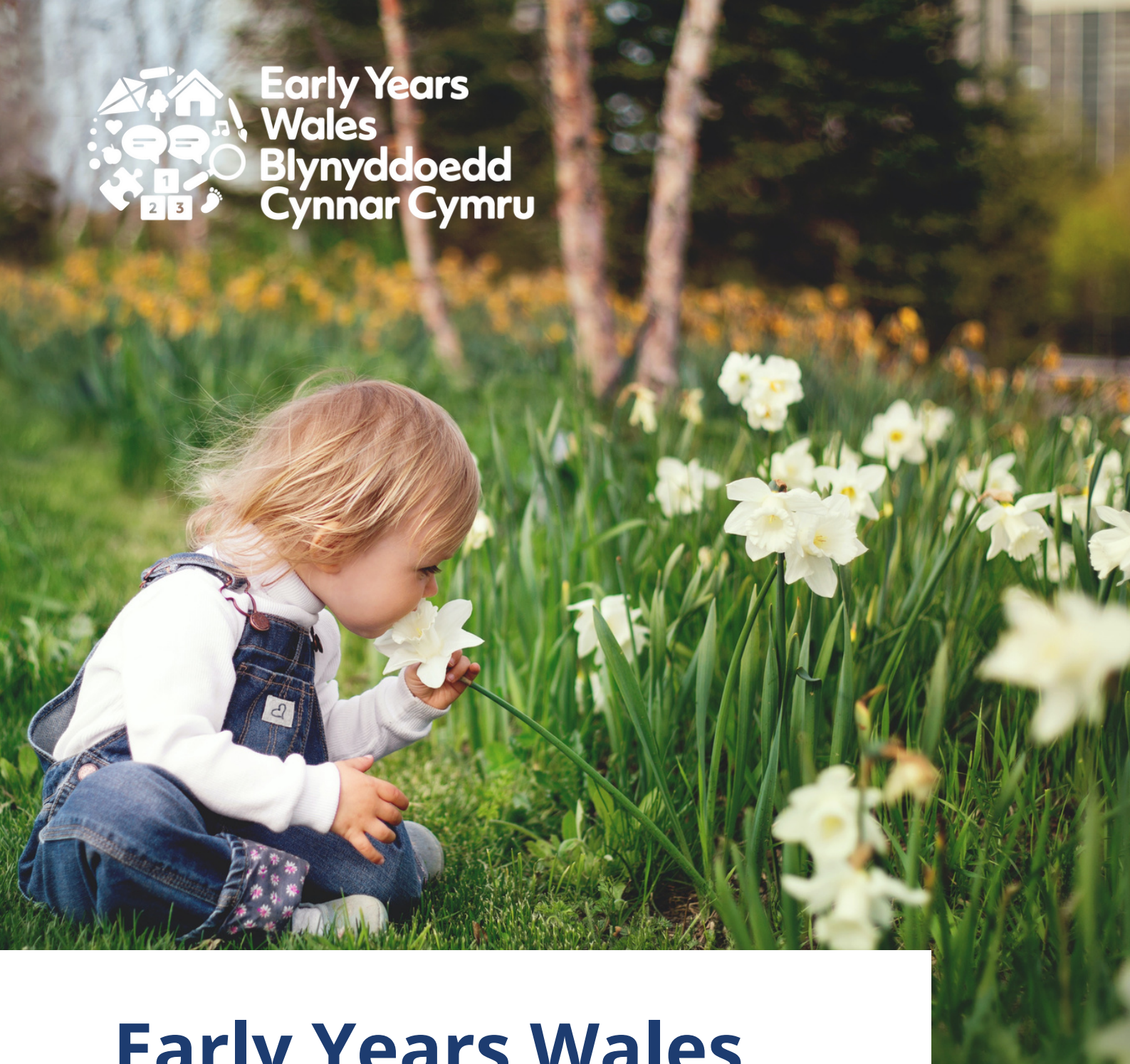

Barring Workshop Online

Course Overview:

This workshop is a must if you are an Employer, Manager or responsible for making employment decisions. It will provide essential information to assist safer recruitment and aims to explore and understand the benefits of DBS and the employer working together, look at the three different referral routes and when a DBS barring referral should be made, including when the legal duty is met. It will also look at Regulated Activity and Relevant Conduct and Harm Test. By the end you will have a clear understanding of the consequences of not making appropriate barring referrals and the consequences of being included in one or both Barred Lists.

- the Wales Safeguarding Procedures and key safeguarding terms
- the need to be child-centred in safeguarding
- potential indicators of abuse, neglect, and harm, including Abuse: Physical, Sexual, Domestic, Emotional Neglect: Physical, Emotional, Medical, Nutritional, Supervisory, Educational, Identity
- their duty to report – when and how to deal with a protection suspicion, concern, or disclosure, including record keeping, sharing information, and making reports
