Early Years Wales Learner of the Year Rachel Cinderby from Cynfran Playgroup, Conwy

Chuckles Nursery in Newport were the first nursery in their area to open at 6am and on bank holidays. A review of their pricing & session structure now enables parents to have an 8 – 12-hour day starting at 6am through to 10am at a standard hourly rate, resulting in a higher uptake. This amongst many initiatives made Chuckles stand out to the judges.



Early Years Wales Practitioner of the Year

Marion Lloyd Chambers from Borthyn Bunnies, Denbighshire

This award was looking for a dedicated, passionate & committed professional who puts the child at the centre of everything they do.

Marion has recently been promoted to acting Playgroup Leader. Her naturally calm and gentle approach encourages the children to learn independently and they feel confident learning through trial and error.
