The secret to success is passion

Sandra Stait – Little Tigers Day Care, Monmouthshire Early Years Wales Learner of the Year 2020

This award was looking to recognise an individual who had clearly demonstrated progression and excellence within the Early Years sector.

Now manager of the Under 3's section, Sandra's journey at Little Tigers Day Care in Rogiet, Monmouthshire started 8-years ago as a Play Assistant.

She was nominated by her colleagues at Little Tigers Day Care for the Learner of the Year Award for successfully completing her **Level 5 CCPLD** under the guidance and support of her assessor at ACT Training, despite undergoing treatment for ill health and struggling with dyslexia.

Pam Curtis, Owner of Little Tigers told us "Sandra runs a tight team of staff, who work to support each other as well as meeting the needs of each individual child. She keeps staff motivated and engaged.

"She carries out every duty a manager would be expected to do and much more, including preparing activities at home, extra planning to meet specific needs, supporting her team of staff out of hours and any other training she can access.

"During her time at Little Tigers Sandra had gained qualifications in areas such as Prevent training, ASD Awareness, City & Guilds Level 3 Award in Transition to Playwork, Food Hygiene, Paediatric First Aid, Foundation Phase training as well as having an active part to play in the setting achieving the **Healthy and sustainable pre-school award** (HSPSS) (see page 8) and Quality for All (QfA) (Highly Commended 2019)

Parent testimonial "My eldest daughter has cerebral palsy and because of Sandra's patience and dedication to caring for children she thrived at nursery and was able to seamlessly integrate into school life and has gone on to become a very confident and independent young girl."



"Sandra has created a calm, natural environment for the children which is also stimulating and engaging for them. She has for example, introduced loose parts, a sensory area and is currently working with parents to minimise dummy and bottle usage (see page 10). This being due to the increase in speech and language difficulties."
