

# Handprint bunting

Bunting is a fun and colourful way to brighten up a setting. It is often used because all children can easily each contribute by creating their own 'flags' which can then be strung together to make a group display.

How to make handprint bunting for your Platinum Jubilee street party

## You will need:

- Handprint bunting template (click here for free template: <https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/handprint-bunting-platinum-jubilee-decoration-ideas-t-tc-1648756798>)
- A4 paper
- Red & blue poster paint
- Paintbrush
- Scissors
- Red or blue ribbon
- Sticky tape

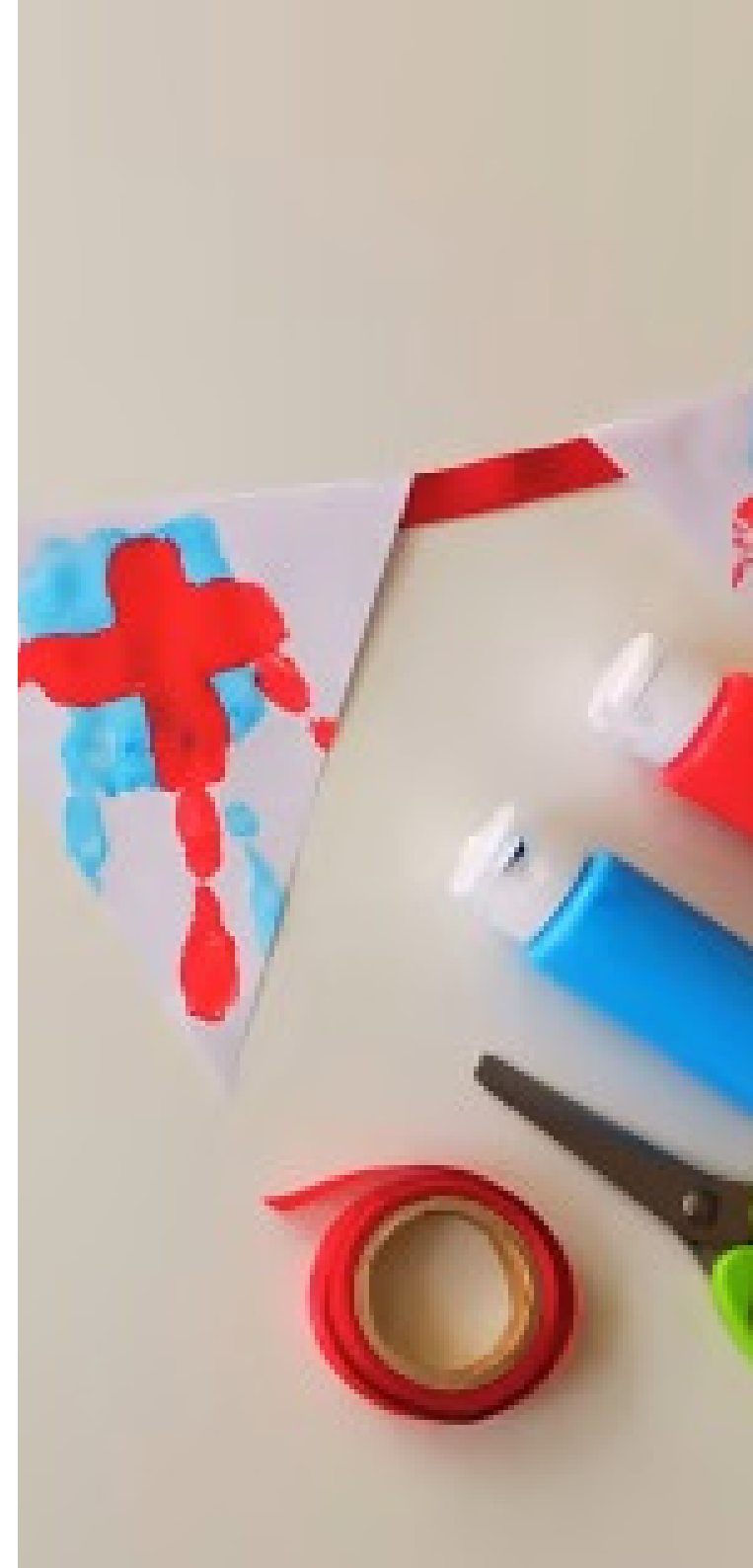

## Method:

1. First, print out the Handprint bunting template onto A4 paper. You will need one print out for each bunting flag.
2. Position the bunting flags on your work surface, pointing the tips away from you.
3. Using the paintbrush, paint the blue paint over your palm and your first and third fingers.
4. Next, push your hand onto one of the bunting flags to make a print.
5. Repeat steps 3 and 4 until you have done a blue handprint on each of your bunting flags. Leave the paint to dry completely.



6. Paint a vertical line of red paint from top the of your second finger down to the bottom of your palm, using the paintbrush.

7. Then, use the paintbrush to paint your little finger in red and a horizontal line from your thumb across your palm.

8. Next, push your hand onto one of the bunting flags to make a print. You will need to position it carefully so that you can still see the blue painted fingers.

9. Repeat steps 6, 7 and 8 until you have done a red handprint on each of your bunting flags. Leave the paint to dry completely.

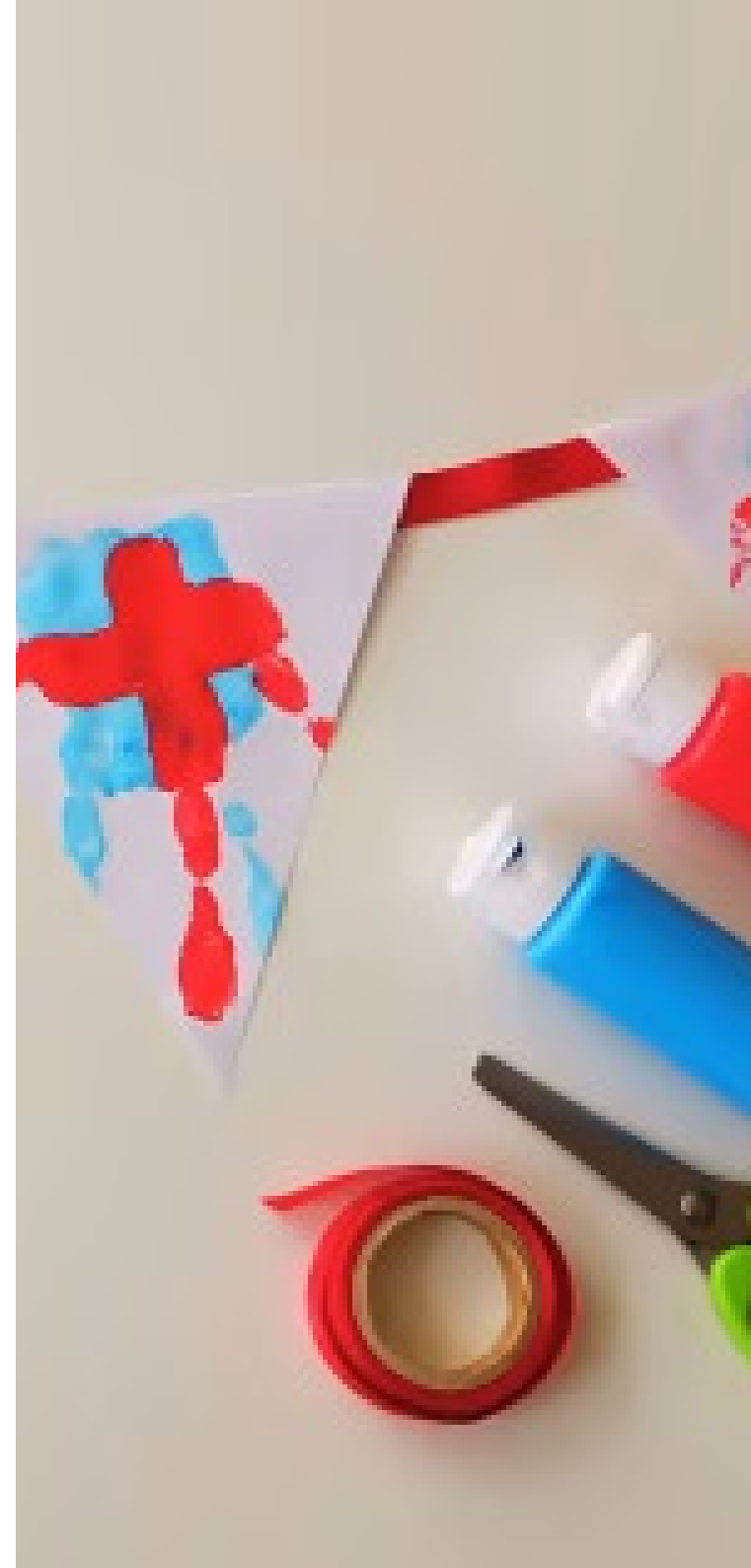
10. When your bunting flags are dry, carefully cut each one out, using scissors.

11. Place each bunting flag face down on your work surface.

12. Next, position your ribbon along the top of each of the bunting flags.

13. Fold down each tab of the flag over the top of the ribbon and secure with a piece of sticky tape.

14. Finally, hang your bunting, ready for your party!
