May Day is celebrated on the 1st of May every year, it's a celebration that originates from the Roman times.

In the past, people would get early in the morning on this day and decorate their homes with flowers, they believed doing this would bring them luck for the rest of the year.

Dawnsio Maypole Traddodiadol

Maypole dancing is one of the oldest May Day traditions. People dance around the maypole while holding onto their piece of ribbon, which is attached at the top. The ribbons become entwined and braid the maypole with lovely colours.

You'll need a pole (or the pole of a sweeping brush), some colourful long ribbon and tape. Push the pole into a soft area of the grass and attach the ribbons to the top with tape. Each child to take a piece of ribbon and weave around each other creating a colourful plaited maypole.
